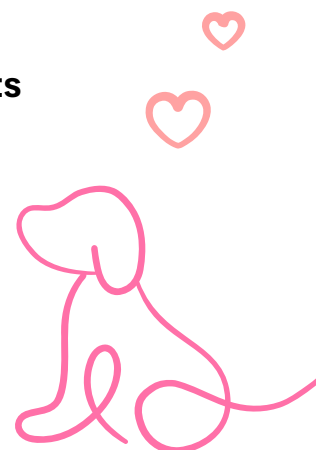


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關於香港導盲犬協會

ABOUT HKGDA

香港導盲犬協會於2011年成立，並根據香港稅務局條例第88條註冊成為慈善機構，提供國際認可的專業服務犬服務。協會成立後積極引進導盲犬，並自2018年起擴大服務範圍，加入動物輔助介入治療，務求令更多有需要人士受惠。

協會屬國際導盲犬聯盟 (IGDF)、Assistance Dogs International (ADI) 和 Animal Assisted Intervention International (AAII) 成員。

我們亦為香港社會服務聯會的會員。

Established in 2011, the Hong Kong Guide Dogs Association (HKGDA) is a registered charitable organization under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance in Hong Kong to provide internationally accredited and professional service dogs. HKGDA has actively introduced and promoted guide dog services in Hong Kong. Since 2018, it has expanded its services to include Animal Assisted Intervention (AAI) program to serve a broader scope of people in need.

HKGDA is an accredited member of the International Guide Dog Federation (IGDF), Assistance Dogs International (ADI) and Animal Assisted Intervention International (AAII).

HKGDA is a member of The Hong Kong Council of Social Service.

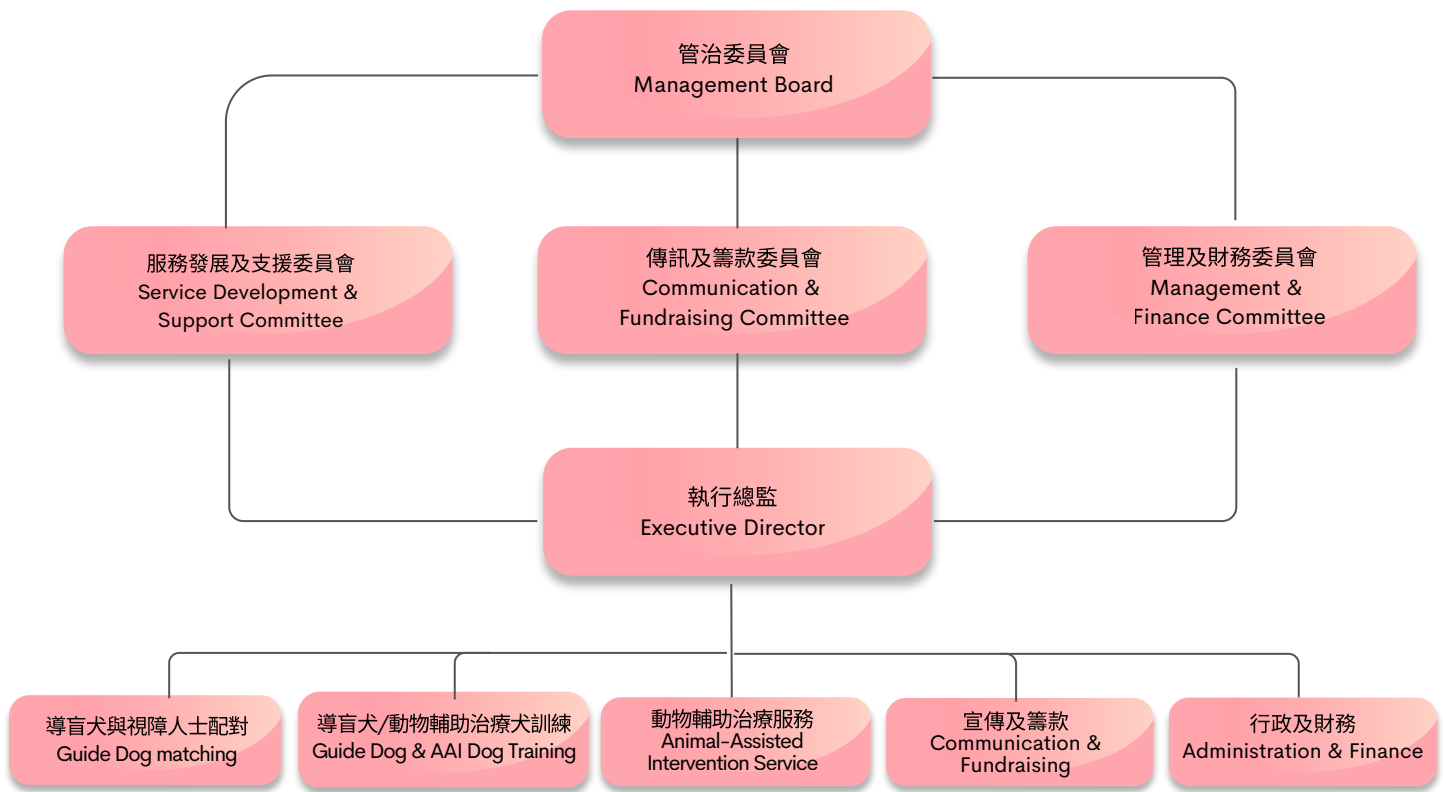

與導盲犬Gaga相處的點滴

大家好，我係視障跑手Gary Leung。導盲犬Gaga在訓練修畢後，便與我一起生活了八年多。

記得最初與導盲犬Gaga一起拍住上走路時，未有百分百信心。Gaga實在很聰明，那次，我在居住的屋邨附近走路，我記得好清楚那條路徑是向前走，便給她指示向前行，但是她拉著我轉方向要繞路，我心想小狗都是信不過的了！結果我撞到，原本路況有變，前方有修路和障礙物，我卻沒有信任Gaga，硬要拉著她向前，攪到自己幾乎受傷呢！那次以後，我信任Gaga。導盲犬受到專業培訓，會自己按實況作出聰明抗命，實在令我讚嘆不已！

導盲犬Gaga感情豐富，她臉上總掛住「讓人呵護」的表情！走進地鐵車箱，她又用這個招牌表情看著部分坐著的乘客，以致那位先生連忙暫起來讓座。我初時不知道，以為Gaga「慢手慢腳」，那麼遲才找到座下的位置。旁人在說，Gaga好似好想得到這個座位啲！原因好簡單，她想食零食啊！因為每次我給Gaga指示：“find the chair”，她帶我找到座位後，我會給她獎賞小食呢！誰知她就是想吃小食，便使用「感動人的眼神」以達到目的！可謂「不擇手段」呢！

天氣有時出猛太陽、有時又下大雨，但是導盲犬Gaga堅守崗位，完成每個任務，安全的帶著我走路！Gaga已融入我的生活中，就連我要離港到海外參加馬拉松比賽，也有帶著她一起！Gaga感情豐富，她會知道我開心或不開心，她會默默地陪伴，她就好似我的「女兒」般。

每次歸家，我首先是要為Gaga用毛巾抹身才入屋，我輕聲的在她耳旁說：「多謝你啊！辛苦晒！」她又用舌頭舔舔我的面；我實在好感激她，有時還會流下開心的淚水呢！

Gaga已十歲了，她將有退休的生活，我祝福她，希望她開心又健康的過每一天。我寫下分享的心聲，希望大家對導盲犬可以認識更多；如果你在街上見到導盲犬，要好好的善待他們啊！

我也期待下一隻同我拍住上的導盲犬來臨我的家，不知她的性情跟Gaga有甚麼不同呢？

GUIDE DOG USER SHARING



Hello everyone, I'm Gary Leung, a visually impaired runner. My guide dog, Gaga, has been living with me for over eight years since completing her training.

I still remember when we first started walking together - I wasn't 100% confident in her abilities. But Gaga is incredibly smart. One time, near my housing estate, I clearly remembered the path ahead and gave her the command to move forward. Instead, she pulled me to turn and took a detour. I thought to myself, "See? You can't trust a dog!" But then - bam - I realized the path had changed: there were construction and obstacles ahead. I hadn't trusted Gaga and stubbornly tried to pull her forward, almost hurting myself! From that moment on, I learned to trust her completely. Guide dogs are professionally trained to perform "intelligence disobedience" based on real-time situations, and I'm still amazed by that!

Gaga is also very expressive - she always wears this "please pamper me" look on her face! Once on the MTR, she gave her signature puppy eyes to a seated passenger, who immediately stood up to offer his seat. At first, I didn't understand why Gaga was "slow" to find a seat. The someone nearby said, "Gaga really wanted that spot, huh?" The reason was simple: she wanted a treat! Because every time I give her the command "find the chair", she gets a snack as a reward after guiding me to a seat. Who knew she'd use her "heart-melting eyes" just to get a treat? Talk about being "determined"!

Whether under scorching sun or heavy rain, Gaga stays dedicated to her duty, safely guiding me through every journey. She's become such a part of my life that I even bring her along when I travel overseas for marathons! Gaga is deeply attuned to my emotions - she knows when I'm happy or upset and quietly stays by my side, just like a "daughter" would.

Every time we come home, I wipe her down with a towel before entering, whispering in her ear, "Thank you! You've worked so hard!" She responds by licking my face, and sometimes, I'm so moved that happy tears are shed.

Gaga is now ten years old and will soon retire. I wish her a joyful and healthy life in her golden years. I'm sharing my story in hopes that more people will understand guide dogs - if you ever see one on the street, please treat them with kindness!

I'm also looking forward to welcoming my next guide dog into my home. I wonder how their personality will differ from Gaga's?

我與 Alfie 的旅程

我是 Winnie。我與 Alfie 的旅程始於 2021 年 1 月，當時香港導盲犬協會（HKGDA）接納我成為義務幼犬寄養家庭，並將 Alfie 帶到我們家中。Alfie 於 2020 年 11 月在香港出生，是導盲犬的後代。最初他被培育為潛在的導盲犬，但在 2023 年中，他轉型為動物輔助治療（AAI）犬。Alfie 憑藉其冷靜的性格、善於社交以及對人類情緒的敏銳反應，在治療與教育環境中發揮了他的恩賜。

這段旅程與我的預期截然不同，但卻充滿意義。就像養育孩子一樣，這段經歷充滿了擔憂、歡笑、喜悅與苦樂交織的時刻。

初期：養育導盲犬幼犬

Alfie 來到我們家時只有七週大。在 HKGDA 訓練員的耐心指導下，我學會了如何以愛與紀律並重的方式養育幼犬。剛到時，Alfie 被安排在一個安全的小區域，有自己的籠子、毛毯和一隻玩具象，讓他感到安心。

從一開始，我們就遵循嚴格的作息：每兩小時帶 Alfie 到指定地點如廁，隨著他逐漸長大，到了一歲時，這個頻率減少到每日三次。這種「在散步前先如廁」的訓練，在颱風或大雨天特別有用，Alfie 從不需要走太遠就能完成如廁。

Alfie 也有「家規」：不可以撿地上的食物（在香港這一點尤其重要，因為食物中毒很常見）；不可隨意嗅聞來標記地盤；不可以乞食，除非食物是主動給他的；不可以玩任何非玩具的物品（例如拖鞋）。儘管有這些規矩，Alfie 仍可自由在屋內活動、在我們房間睡覺，並接受家人甚至陌生人的撫摸及擁抱。我們也會帶他到公園與認識的狗一起放鬆奔跑。

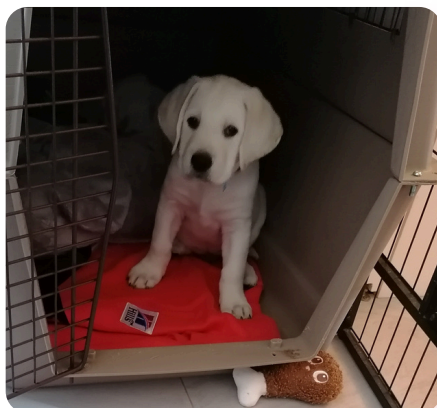
社交與探索

訓練 Alfie 的社交能力是一件樂事。他時常陪伴我到不同的地方：超級市場、街市、商場，甚至香港國際機場。他也習慣了各種交通工具：私家車、巴士、港鐵、渡輪、小巴，甚至山頂纜車。

有了 Alfie 之後，我們更多探索香港，特別在秋季行遠足徑。難怪導盲犬使用者常說，他們的狗不僅為他們引路，也豐富了他們的社交生活。

苦樂參半的告別

2022 年 10 月，Alfie 離開我們，因為繼續接受訓練而需要前往另一個寄養家庭。雖然 HKGDA 早已讓我們為這一刻做好心理準備，但情感上仍有不捨。我們帶著祝福與他道別，希望他能成為導盲犬，改變一位視障人士的生活。我們也安慰自己，若 Alfie 退休後，使用者無法繼續照顧他，我們可以申請讓他回到我們身邊。

意想不到的轉折

2023 年 11 月，HKGDA 聯絡我，帶來了一個意想不到的消息：Alfie 被評估為不適合成為導盲犬，將轉型為 AAI 犬。我懷著感激與喜悅的心情，欣然接受了成為他的領犬員的角色。

自此之後，Alfie 與我一起提供動物輔助治療（AAT）服務：主要服務於特殊學習需要（SEN）學校；也參與 AAI 教育講座，偶爾探訪安老院。Alfie 特別喜歡與小朋友互動，因為這些互動更動態、更有趣。他曾在一小時內被 50 隻小手輕輕撫摸，也會靜靜坐在壓力大的孩子身旁，並與 HKGDA 的治療師合作，幫助自閉症兒童發展語言與社交技巧。

Alfie 在辦公室

我也會帶 Alfie 到我的辦公室，他深受同事歡迎，大家經常要求他的陪伴，笑說：「我們也需要療癒！」有一次，兩位同事之間出現緊張氣氛，Alfie 察覺到後主動走近他們，他們開始撫摸他，氣氛立刻緩和下來。這個簡單的互動化解了衝突，讓他們能冷靜理性地解決分歧。

展望未來

我期待繼續擔任 Alfie 的領犬員，陪伴他參與各種服務使命，在未來幫助更多孩子。我衷心希望動物輔助治療服務能在香港獲得更廣泛的接受與應用，就像世界其他地區一樣。Alfie 對孩子、同事甚至陌生人的影響，正是人與動物之間深厚連結的見證。

My Journey with Alfie

I am Winnie. My journey with Alfie began in January 2021, when trainers from the Hong Kong Guide Dogs Association (HKGDA) recruited me as a volunteer puppy raiser and brought Alfie into our home. Born in Hong Kong in November 2020, Alfie is a descendant of guide dogs. Initially raised as a potential guide dog, he later transitioned into an Animal Assisted Intervention (AAI) dog in mid-2023 where his calm temperament, sociability and responsiveness to human emotions have proven highly effective in therapeutic and educational settings.

This journey has unfolded quite differently from what I had originally anticipated, yet it has been profoundly rewarding. Much like raising a child, it has been filled with moments of worry, laughter, joy, and bittersweetness.

Early Days: Raising a Guide Dog Puppy

Alfie arrived at our home when he was just seven weeks old. With the patient guidance of HKGDA trainers, I learned how to raise a puppy with both love and discipline. Upon arrival, Alfie was given a small, secure area with his own crate, blanket, and a toy elephant, helping him feel safe and settled.

From the outset, we followed a strict routine: Alfie was taken to the same spot every two hours to relieve himself (every 4–5 hours at night). As he grew older, this schedule was gradually reduced to three times a day by the time he turned one. This discipline—training a potential guide dog to relieve first before going for a walk—proved invaluable, as during typhoons or heavy rain, Alfie never needed to walk long before relieving himself.

At home, Alfie was trained not to: eat food off the floor (a crucial habit in Hong Kong, where food poisoning is common); not to sniff around unnecessarily to mark territory; not to beg for food unless it was offered; not to play with anything other than his toys (e.g., slippers). Despite these house rules, Alfie was free to roam the flat, sleep in our room, and enjoy affection from not only our family but anyone he met. We also took him for off-leash runs in parks with dogs we knew.

Socialisation and Exploration

Training Alfie in socialisation was a joy. I brought him almost everywhere: supermarkets, wet markets, shopping malls, and even Hong Kong International Airport to see my son off. He became accustomed to various modes of transport: car, bus, MTR, ferry, minibus, and even the Peak Tram.

With Alfie in our lives, we began exploring more of Hong Kong, especially for hikes in autumn. It is no surprise that guide dog users often share how their dogs not only guide them but also enrich their social lives.

A Bittersweet Goodbye

In October 2022, Alfie left us to live with another family as part of his formal training. While we had been prepared for this moment by the HKGDA Puppy Raiser Coordinator, it was still emotionally difficult. We bid him farewell with blessings, hoping he would one day become a guide dog and transform the life of a visually impaired person. We also took comfort in knowing that, should Alfie retire, and his user be unable to care for him, we could apply to have him live with us again.

A Surprising Turn of Events

In November 2023, HKGDA contacted me with unexpected news: Alfie had been disqualified from becoming a guide dog and would instead pursue a new path as an AAI dog. With a heart full of gratitude and joy, I gladly accepted the role of his handler.

Since then, Alfie and I have provided Animal Assisted Therapy (AAT) services in schools, primarily Special Educational Needs (SEN) schools; participated in AAI education talks and occasionally visited elderly homes. Alfie particularly enjoys working with children, as the interactions are more dynamic and engaging. He patiently embraced being gently patted by 50 pairs of hands in an hour, sits quietly beside stressed children, and collaborates with HKGDA therapists to support autistic children in developing speech and social skills.

I also bring Alfie to my office, where he is warmly welcomed by colleagues who often request his presence—after all, they need therapy too! Alfie's calming influence was once put to the test when tension arose between two colleagues. Sensing the discord, Alfie approached them, and the atmosphere immediately softened as they began to pat him. This simple interaction helped defuse the situation, allowing the colleagues to resolve their differences calmly and rationally.

Looking Ahead

I look forward to continuing as Alfie's handler, accompanying him on various service missions and helping more children in the years to come. I sincerely hope that Animal Assisted Intervention services will gain broader acceptance and utilisation in Hong Kong, as they have in many other parts of the world. Alfie's impact on children, colleagues, and even strangers is a testament to the transformative power of the human-animal bond.

本協會的導盲犬全都通過國際認可的專業訓練，能加強及協助視障人士更安全地自由出行。導盲犬除了可以引導他們安全到達目的地、避開道路上的障礙物及不平坦路況，亦是視障人士很重要的朋友、夥伴，甚至家人。我們的服務包括：

- 種犬與繁殖
- 幼犬培訓及導盲犬訓練
- 配對訓練與支援服務
- 導盲犬服務發展

種犬與繁殖

自協會於2017年開始進行本地繁殖計劃，我們一直努力不懈地物色合適的種犬，並與外國的導盲犬學校合作引入優秀及基因穩定的犬隻，以便提升本港的導盲犬的數量和優質的血統。與此同時，協會亦建立了一隊幼犬支援義工小組，應對幼犬初期需要的全面照顧。



Our guide dogs are trained with international standards to provide services for people with visual impairment, improving their mobility and safety. They can lead their users to his/her destination safely by avoiding obstacles and irregularities on the road. Guide dogs also become an important part of the family and act as their companion. Our services include:

- Breeding & Whelping
- Puppy Raising and Guide Dog Training
- Guide Dog Matching & Aftercare Services
- Guide Dog Services Development

BREEDING & WHELPING

HKGDA started a Local Guide Dog Breeding Program in 2017, choosing potential breeding dogs locally and internationally. We have been working with overseas guide dog schools and exchanging dogs with excellent pedigrees and genes to increase the number of guide dogs and bloodline quality of guide dogs in Hong Kong. At the same time, we have also established a litter support volunteer team to cope with the tremendous work involved in puppy raising.

幼犬培訓

在幼犬出生 2 個月到大約 14 個月後，牠們會進入寄養家庭生活，並進行基本訓練，例如基本服從、於指定時間及地點如廁、外出到不同地方進行社會化訓練等。除此之外在與家人一起生活的過程中，牠們體驗到來自人類的關懷和愛，養成溫馴親人的性格。

PUPPY RAISING

The puppy will live with its puppy raising family and follow basic trainings between 2 and 14 months old, such as obedience, toilet training, going out to different places for socialization training and so on. Moreover, they will experience care and love from us and develop a gentle and friendly character.

寄宿家庭

在大約 14-18 個月大的時候，幼犬踏入成熟期，體格亦已完全成熟，這時正是開始正式訓練的最佳時機。與此同時，幼犬亦會轉為與新的寄宿家庭同住約 6-9 個月。寄宿家庭的主要工作是接送訓練中的導盲犬到學校上課，以及在訓練師的指導下與牠們在日常生活中進行訓練。

BOARDER

Dogs at 14-18 months old are ideal to start official training as they will be mentally and physically mature. They will live with a new boarder family for approximately 6-9 months, and the boarder's mission is to pick up and drop off training guide dogs to school and provide daily training under the instruction of our trainers.

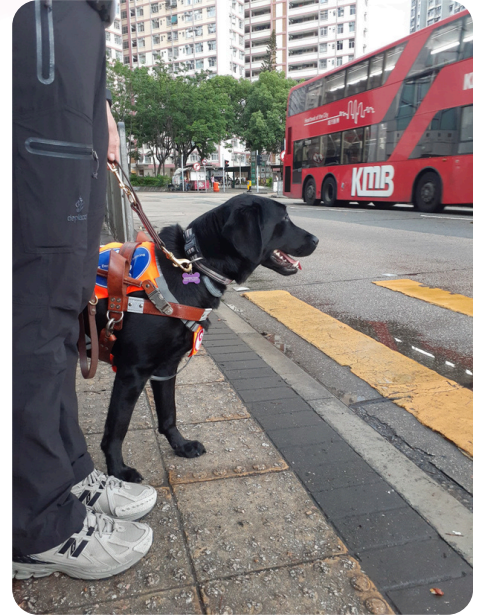

導盲犬訓練

我們使用食物和讚許的正向訓練方法去訓練導盲犬，包括身體和語言上的獎勵，例如撫摸狗狗的背部或口頭上的稱讚等，可以加強牠們的動力和自信心，使牠們更願意進行導盲犬的工作。導盲犬除了學習如何引導使用者安全避開路面障礙物外，還要學習「智慧不服從指令」。當導盲犬收到有潛在危險的指令時，導盲犬會被教導不服從該指令，例如當有車輛駛過馬路時，即使接收到指令，導盲犬亦不會前進過馬路。同時，導盲犬能夠免受任何外界的干擾，專注地引領使用者到達目的地。



GUIDE DOG TRAINING

Our guide dogs are trained using the positive reinforcement method, in which we use both treats and praise rewards. They include physical and verbal rewards, such as petting their backs gently or verbal appreciation with a warm and kind voice. Positive Reinforcement helps guide dogs feel happy with their work. Guide dogs not only learn how to lead their users to avoid obstacles safely, but are also trained in 'intelligent disobedience'. If they are given a command under an environment with potential danger, they are taught not to follow it. For example, guide dogs will refuse to cross the road if there is oncoming traffic. They are also trained to be highly concentrated and able to avoid all kinds of distractions while working.

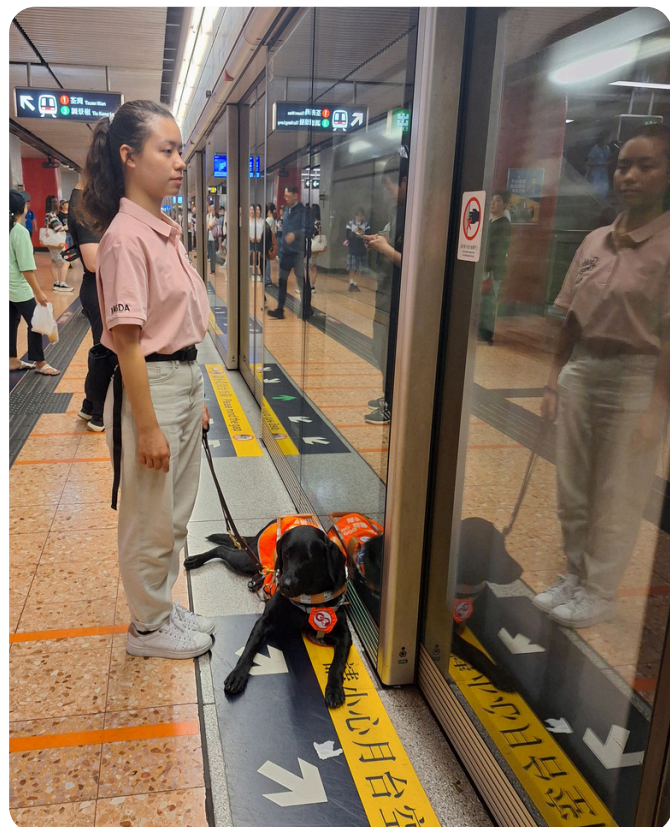

配對訓練與支援服務

當導盲犬成功完成所有訓練後，便會與成功申請的視障人士進行配對。此配對過程是要確保配對的導盲犬符合申請者的需求，成為視障人士的長期夥伴。

整個共同訓練需要約三至四星期，當中包括利用一連串指令、動作及身體姿勢，練習與導盲犬溝通、互相合作及培養默契。此外，在訓練期間，我們亦會教導使用者日常如何照顧其導盲犬及有關的動物福利。

當導盲犬滿10歲、或因體能問題需要提前退休，協會會為導盲犬提供終身支援服務，我們會先考慮把導盲犬留在使用者身邊讓牠們安享晚年。若果使用者不能照顧退休的導盲犬，我們會將導盲犬交給最初照顧牠們的寄養家庭。如果以上兩個方案都不行，我們會將導盲犬交給能夠給予牠們愛與關懷的公眾人士領養。

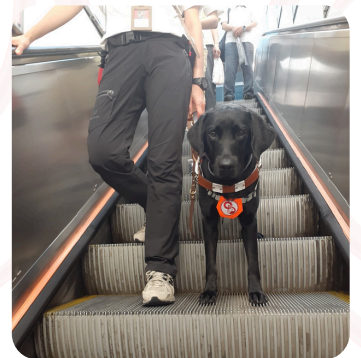


PARTNERSHIPS & AFTERCARE SERVICES

When a guide dog has successfully completed its training, they will be matched with a guide dog applicant. The matching process is to ensure that the match meets the requirements of the applicants.

The whole matching process takes approximately 3 to 4 weeks. It includes instructions and communication skills with their guide dog by using a series of commands, body positions and languages. In addition, the user will also learn how to properly care and maintain the welfare of their dog.

When guide dogs reach the age of 10 or cannot physically fulfil their guide dog duties, they will retire. HKGDA offers lifelong support to all of our guide dogs. The first priority for retired guide dogs is to let them continue living with their users as retiring in the same home is often the most positive option for both dogs and users. If the user cannot keep the retired dog, the dog will be offered to the original puppy raising family. If both options failed, we would rehome the dog to a loving and caring family.



導盲犬服務

導盲犬服務發展 - 香港導盲犬學苑

香港導盲犬學苑將於2025年完成前流浮山警署的活化工程，將其轉型為一個多功能的培育及教育基地。該項目歷時數年，不僅保留歷史建築的特色，還將改善空間裝潢與用途，以滿足犬隻培育和公眾教育的需求。學苑將設有專業的幼犬社會化訓練區、高級技能訓練場地，以及模擬公共環境的實習空間，為犬隻提供全面且系統化的訓練環境。

學苑的核心目標之一是提升公眾對導盲犬的認知。透過舉辦開放日、導賞活動及互動展覽，學苑向訪客展示導盲犬和輔助治療犬的訓練過程。例如，學苑將設計實境演示，讓參觀者能直觀了解犬隻在實際情境中的表現。此外，學苑將警署的歷史建築與犬隻訓練設施相結合，生動地連結社區記憶與現代社會服務，進一步強化公眾對導盲犬工作的理解與支持。

除了犬隻的培育，學苑亦致力於提升社會對導盲犬及輔助治療犬的認識，並促進包容性社會的發展。透過定期舉辦的導盲犬講座，學苑讓公眾了解導盲犬的訓練過程及其對使用者生活的改善，從而增強社會的共融意識。這些活動不僅提供了知識，還為參與者創造了與導盲犬互動的機會，進一步消除對視障人士及其導盲犬的偏見。

展望未來，香港導盲犬學苑計劃進一步擴展其服務範疇，增強與社區的聯繫，並持續改善犬隻的訓練質素。學苑希望推出導賞團，並與學校合作開發生命教育課程，以普及導盲犬的知識。透過這些創新舉措，學苑旨在成為推動香港包容性社會的重要樞紐，讓每位需要幫助的人都能獲得所需的支持，並享受更高的生活質量。

GUIDE DOG SERVICES DEVELOPMENT - HONG KONG GUIDE DOGS ACADEMY

The Hong Kong Guide Dogs Academy target to complete the revitalization of the former Lau Fau Shan Police Station, in 2025, transforming it into a multifunctional breeding and educational hub. This project took several years and not only preserve the historical architecture but also enhance the space's layout and functionality to meet the needs of dog breeding and public education. The Academy features specialized areas for puppy socialization, advanced skills training facilities, and simulated public environments for practical training, providing a comprehensive and systematic training environment for the dogs.

A key objective of the Academy is to enhance public awareness of guide dogs. Through open days, guided tours, and interactive exhibitions, the Academy showcases the training processes of guide dogs and animal-assisted intervention (AAI) dogs. For instance, the Academy will introduce live demonstration that allows visitors to gain firsthand insight into the dogs' performance in real-world scenarios. Additionally, the Academy creatively integrates the historical aspects of the police station with dog training facilities, vividly connecting community memories with contemporary social services and strengthening public understanding and support for guide dogs' work.

Beyond dog breeding, the Academy is dedicated to raising societal awareness about guide dogs and AAI dogs, thereby promoting an inclusive society. By hosting regular lectures on guide dogs, the Academy educates the public about the training processes and their significant impact on users' lives, fostering greater social inclusiveness. These activities not only impart knowledge but also provide opportunities for participants to interact with the dogs, helping to eliminate biases against visually impaired individuals and their guide dogs.

Looking to the future, the Hong Kong Guide Dogs Academy plans to expand its range of services, strengthen community connections, and continuously enhance the quality of dog training. The Academy aims to launch guided tours and collaborate with schools to develop life education courses to spread awareness about guide dogs. Through these innovative initiatives, the Academy aspires to be a pivotal hub for promoting an inclusive society in Hong Kong, ensuring that everyone in need can receive the support they require and enjoy an improved quality of life.



動物輔助治療服務

ANIMAL ASSISTED INTERVENTION SERVICES

協會於2018年開始提供犬隻輔助治療服務，旨在幫助更多有需要的人士。現時協會是 Assistance Dogs International (ADI) 和 Animal Assisted Intervention International (AAI) 的成員。

在過去的一年中，動物輔助介入服務是我們機構的重要服務，我們致力於通過結合犬隻和專業治療師/引導員的協作，為不同年齡層和需求的群體提供身心健康支援，旨在改善他們的情緒、社交、行為和認知能力。這份報告將回顧2023-2024年度的主要成果、挑戰以及未來發展計劃。

The Association began providing Animal Assisted Intervention (AAI) services in 2018 to support a wider scope of people in need. Currently, the association is an accredited member of Assistance Dogs International (ADI) and Animal Assisted Intervention International (AAII).

Over the past year, AAI services have been a cornerstone of our organization's services. Through the collaboration of trained AAI dogs and professional therapists/facilitators, we aim to enhance the emotional, social, behavioral, and cognitive well-being of diverse age groups and needs. This report summarizes the key achievements and challenges of the 2023–2024 period, and future development plans.



動物輔助介入服務最主要分為三大範疇：動物輔助治療、動物輔助活動及動物輔助教育。服務對象涵蓋但不局限於自閉症譜系障礙兒童，學校和特殊教育機構的學生。

Our AAI services primarily fall into three categories: Animal Assisted Therapy (AAT), Animal Assisted Activities (AAA), and Animal Assisted Education (AAE). These services target a wide range of beneficiaries, including but not limited to children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and students from mainstream and special education institutions.



動物輔助治療服務

ANIMAL ASSISTED INTERVENTION SERVICES

動物輔助治療

動物輔助治療是由註冊/認可執照的治療師，主要以受過訓練的犬隻動物，通過設計合適的治療方案，進行個人或小組治療，以改善服務使用者的身心健康。動物輔助治療可以組合不同的專業治療以達到治療效果，例如職業治療、物理治療、言語治療、心理治療或行為治療等。



動物輔助活動

動物輔助活動是讓服務對象學童與犬隻動物一起參與活動，以促進其身心健康，並透過人與動物之間的互動，令服務對象學童精神放鬆以及產生愉悅的情緒。



動物輔助教育

動物輔助教育是由註冊/認可執照的教育專業人員，運用受過訓練的犬隻動物來設計教學活動，以促進學童的學習。動物輔助教育可以應用在常規課程，亦可應用於情緒教育、生命教育和特殊教育等課題上。



ANIMAL ASSISTED THERAPY (AAT)

AAT is conducted by licensed/registered therapists using trained therapy dogs to deliver individualized or group therapy sessions designed to improve clients' physical and mental well-being. AAT can be integrated with other professional therapies, such as occupational therapy, physiotherapy, speech therapy, psychotherapy, or behavioural therapy, to maximize therapeutic outcomes.

ANIMAL ASSISTED ACTIVITY (AAA)

AAA engages participants in interactive sessions with therapy dogs to promote mental and emotional well-being. Through human-animal interactions, these activities help reduce stress and foster positive emotions.

ANIMAL ASSISTED EDUCATION (AAE)

AAE involves licensed/registered educators incorporating trained therapy dogs into structured learning activities to enhance students' engagement and development. This approach can be applied to standard curricula as well as specialized programs like emotional education, life education, and special needs education.



動物輔助治療服務



ANIMAL ASSISTED INTERVENTION SERVICES

活動項目與成果

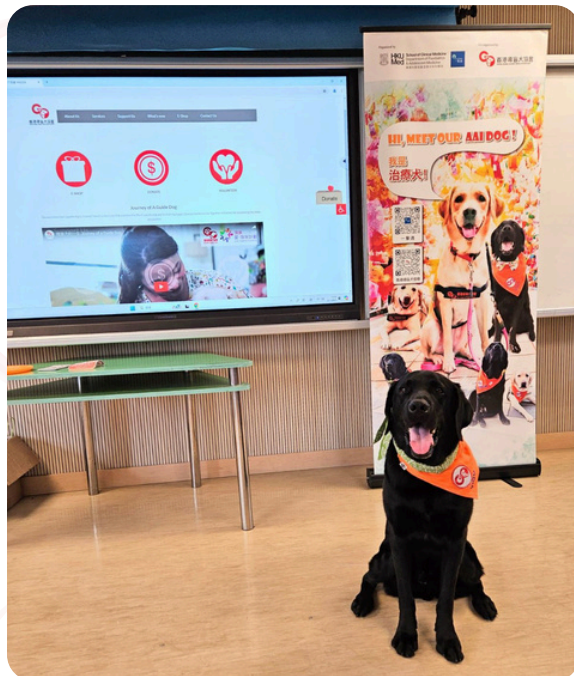
本協會的動物輔助介入服務都是以團體形式進行，每節通常為45-60分鐘。在本年度，協會共為52間學校、機構、社區中心等提供服務（服務包括動物輔助介入服務的三大範疇和動物輔助治療講座），服務總時長超過170個小時，服務總人次超過13,000人。特殊教育需要的學生為動物輔助治療服務的主要對象，在本年度，特殊教育需要學生的服務人次超過5,000人，佔服務總人次接近40%。

協會亦於本年度與香港大學合作展開有關動物輔助介入服務的研究（心靈健康學校外展計劃和狗狗伴我行- 心靈篇）。在此研究項目，本協會提供了動物輔助活動給30間學校，每間學校2節，共60節活動。同時亦提供了動物輔助治療服務給8間特殊學校，每間學校16節，共128節服務，服務人次超過9,500人。

Programs and Outcomes

Our AAI services are conducted in group settings, with each session lasting 45–60 minutes. This year, we served 52 schools, institutions, and community centers, delivering over 170 service hours across all three AAI categories (including educational seminars), with the total beneficiaries exceeding 13,000. Over 5,000 students with special educational needs (SEN) have benefacted from the AAI services, about 40% of the total beneficiaries.

In collaboration with The University of Hong Kong, we launched research projects on AAI services (School Outreach Program to Improve Student Mental Health After COVID-19 Pandemic School Closure, and Impact of Animal-Assisted Intervention Dogs on the Performance Behaviors of Special Needs Children). As part of this initiative, we provided 60 AAA sessions (2 sessions per school) for 30 schools, and 128 AAT sessions (16 sessions per school) for 8 special education schools, benefiting over 9,500 participants.

隨著合作的機構及學校越來越多，本協會的動物輔助介入服務亦開始廣為人認識。本會亦會繼續積極推廣，招募人才並提供培訓，希望可以增加團隊的規模，確保服務質素。

Challenges and Future Plans

As the number of collaborating organizations and schools continues to grow, our association's AAI services have become increasingly well-known. We will continue to actively promote these services, recruit talent, and provide training in hopes of expanding our team and ensuring service quality.

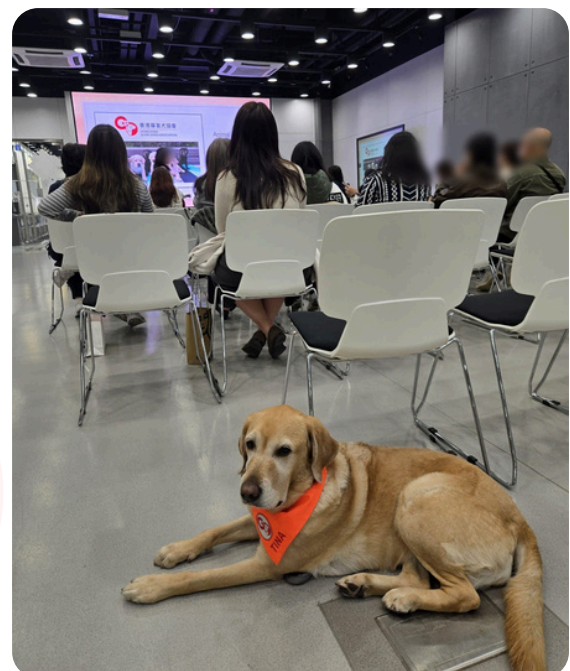

2024-2025年度

香港導盲犬協會「互動體驗日」及「暑期開放日」

Hong Kong Guide Dogs Association "Interactive Experience Day" and "Summer Open Day"

Since 2022, the "Interactive Experience Day" and "Summer Open Day" hosted by our association have been highly popular among parents and children, and we now hold them regularly every month to allow more participants to join! Through visiting our association, participants gain an in-depth understanding of the association's functions and services, as well as the training processes and service scenarios of guide dogs and AAI dogs. During the event, participants can listen to visually impaired individuals sharing their real-life experiences of living with guide dogs, thereby fostering empathy and compassion. At the same time, they can learn the proper ways to interact with visually impaired individuals and guide dogs, such as the "Three Don'ts and One Do" rule (No rejecting, No feeding, No distracting, Do enquire). Professional trainers will provide on-site explanations and guide dog training demonstration, leaving a lasting impression on participants. Finally, participants can interact closely with guide dogs and AAI dogs, take photos with the "Little Q's" for keepsakes, and enjoy a fulfilling and meaningful experience. Each participant will also receive a souvenir, making the event both memorable and rewarding!





2024年10月12日

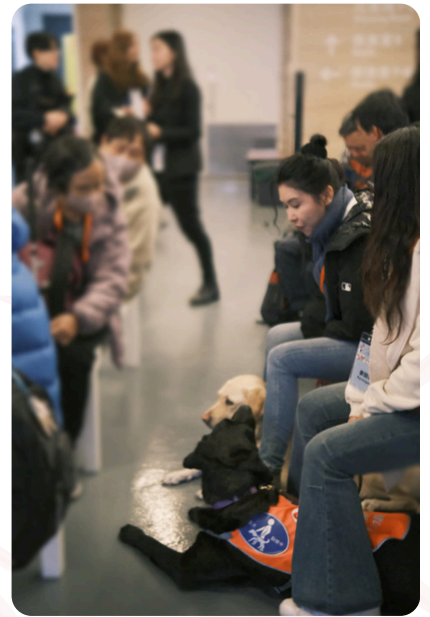




2025年1月11日
